# Salvation is By God's Grace


Because of sin we can never earn it (Eph. 2:1-3)

- Paul: "grace working through me"
  - Ephesians 3:7-8
  - 1 Corinthians 15:9-10
  - Colossians 1:29

- God's grace can work through us!
  - Ephesians 1:19, 3:20
