- Mary "Where did they move" Jesus' body?" (v. 2)
- Peter and John "What just" happened?"
  - Faith (v. 8)
  - But incomplete faith (v. 9-10, 2:22)

## Mary Magdalene v. 11-18

Overwhelming grief (v. 11, 13, 15)

• Transformation to relief (v. 16) and assurance (v. 17)

Where do we find hope in loss?



<sup>13</sup> But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers *and sisters*, about those who are asleep, so that you will not grieve as indeed the rest *of mankind do*, who have no hope. <sup>14</sup> For if we believe that Jesus died and rose *from the dead*, so also God will bring with Him those who have fallen asleep through Jesus.
