Paul modeled true discipleship (Luke 9:23-25)

All in for Jesus

Committed to Service

A fundraiser for poor Jewish Christians in Jerusalem (1 Corinthians 16:1-4, 2 Corinthians 8-9)

A symbol of unity (Romans 15:25-28)

Paul was willing to die for unity

3. Paul removed obstacles

Acts 21:15-26

Removed Obstacles

Proposal: observe a custom to clarify your position (see Numbers 16, Acts 18:18, 24:17)

Not a compromise, but an accommodation for the gospel's sake (1 Corinthians 9:20,23)

Paul knew what hills to die on
