#### Context: deliverance from exile

- King Cyrus Is. 44:28-45:1
- Israel's response "what?!"
- God's answer Is. 45:11-13

- Clay still has free will
  - Jeremiah 18:1-12

# Isaiah 45:9-10 questioning God's ways



- What's God doing in the world today?
  - War, poverty, persecution, sin
  - God is still in control!

- What's God doing in my life today?
  - James 1:2-4
  - 2 Corinthians 12:7-10

### Isaiah 64:8-9

Israel to God: "We are clay in your hands."



- Precisely the opposite attitude!
  - Confessing sin Is. 64:5-7
  - Pleading for help Is. 64:8-9
- God's answer: "all things new"
  - Isaiah 65:17-19
